sites on Beeley Moor yesterday was eventful for us all. Thank you to Liz Walker for leading us on the visit. For me it was the first time I had walked around the moor and it was fascinating to see the views and how these sites linked to the Nine Ladies and other prehistoric sites. The visit ended with a car fire and the arrival of two fire engines, fortunately everyone was safe and no-one was hurt, but it is a visit that none of us will forget.

Our next site visit is on **Wednesday 17th July at 10am** led by Kevin Wagstaffe and John Entwistle. Kevin writes, 'we will start at the National Trust car park next to the Robin Hood Inn, just outside Baslow. It is a Pay & Display car park. Due to limited parking, it is my intention to meet at 10.00am. The site visit will involve a few miles

or so over moorland looking at features along Gardom's Edge and possibly on to Birchen Edge, the latter will be dependent on distance and ascent involved. We will be studying ring cairns, standing stones and rock art as well as lots of other goodies. More details to follow in the first week of July'. We will then have a break in August before resuming our meetings in the autumn. Our meeting on Tuesday 17th September at 2pm in the Imperial Rooms, Matlock will be led by Meghan King, Finds Liaison Officer (Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire), who will be speaking about recent archaeological finds in the county and showing pictures and

There will be a talk in the Cromford Mills/Belper North Mill Highlighting Heritage Series about the amazing archive of Smedley's Mill in Lea Green near Cromford on 27 June at 1930.

The talk will take place in **Belper at No38 on the Market Square** and be given by the well known local speaker and Smedley's Archive Manager, Jane Middleton Smith.

The Archive, now a charitable trust, must be one of the fullest collections in the UK of material on all aspects of an industrial enterprise over the 240 years of its existence. The collection includes paintings, photographs, letters and personal artefacts connected with the Smedley family and importantly also the generations of mill workers. For over 240 years, the villages of Lea, Dethick and Holloway and the surrounding local landscape, have been dominated by the presence of a textile mill. Operational by the start of 1784, the mill began its working life spinning cotton, with generations of the Smedley family, working with tireless energy and determination to convert the machinery to also spin wool. By the 1830's and under the leadership of John Smedley II, the John Smedley mill was very successfully twisting fine quality merino yarn and manufacturing newly fashionable items of knitted woollen underwear. John Smedley's undergarments became famous for their quality and luxury and legend has it that the 'long-john' was named after him.
